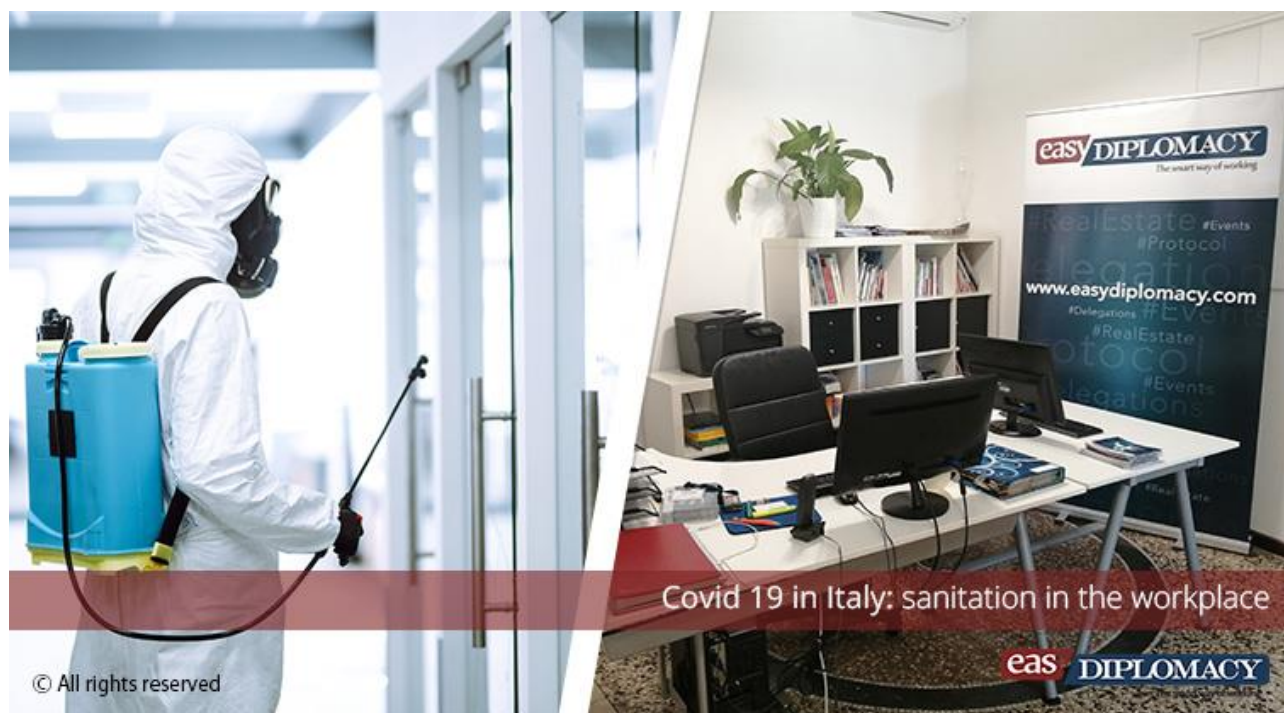


SANITATION IN THE WORKPLACES

WHAT TO DO BEFORE THE SANITATION TREATMENT



Sanitation operations involve the saturation of environments with hydrogen peroxide aerosol, which of all the products used to sanitize, is the least invasive for both smooth and porous surfaces. The product can also be safely used on the **carpet of corridors**, as the product particles will not damage the fabric and will not leave any halo or stain.

WHAT TO DO BEFORE THE TREATMENT?

Few steps are required to ensure that the service is performed safely and effectively:

- ✓ Personnel must not be present while the sanitation treatment is being performed. Premises should be clear
- ✓ It is advisable that all premises required to be treated shall be in a good state of cleanliness
- ✓ It is recommended to switch off the fire-fighting system in case of high-pressure atomisation of the disinfectant by aerosol
- ✓ It is recommended to cover particularly sensitive electrical or mechanical parts and switchboards
- ✓ Please be aware that all covers will be provided by the company performing the sanitation treatment

- ✓ It is requested to open every internal room to speed up the sanitation operations
- ✓ It is advisable to close the doors of the following rooms:
 1. C.E.D. - Data Processing Centre;
 2. Server Rooms
 3. Security Control Room (if you have many very delicate technological devices)
- ✓ It is recommended to close:
 - food and crockery in protected areas
 - windows / balconies
- ✓ It is advisable to move any ornamental plants to outdoor areas to prevent them from suffering with the treatment
- ✓ It is requested to temporarily switch off any ventilation systems suitable for air recirculation

NOTE: It is always advisable to enter the premises **after at least 2- 3 hours after treatment**, taking care to ventilate the treated areas.

THE CERTIFICATE OF SUCCESSFUL SANITATION

In order to be able to issue a Sanitation Certificate, companies must meet specific requirements, i.e. they must be companies operating in the cleaning and pest control sector.

The Certificate must contain information regarding the place, time and method of sanitation, in accordance with the Ministry of Health Circular No. 5443 of 22 February 2020.
